Seeds of Hope Program

Shifra Homes is pleased to announce that we have expanded our services during this past year with a new program called Seeds of Hope.

Each one of our residents is admitted into our program with no support, the clothes on their back, and the future of our society in their wombs. We have to secure clothing, food, supplies, toiletries, computers, phones, baby items and so much more to assist these young women. Providing them with not only all of the assistance during their pregnancy and subsequent months after but to also have the ability to also assist them with the process of integration back into society successfully is our ultimate goal. We empower these young women to have a successful transition and the ability to break the cycle of poverty and homelessness. We house approximately a minimum of 10 women per year. In addition, to these young women that we help it is evident that our care and service is only measurable to a certain extent. It is hard to quantify the future benefit that these soon to be children will have as a result of the love and care that they receive while under our protection and care.

Each young woman will be provided with extra resources to be able to successfully move out of Shifra Homes back into the community in a safe environment for herself and her baby. These funds would be used for each resident according to her needs. They often need furniture, housewares and other items that we do not have the ability at the time of their move to secure for them. It will also be used to assist them with the costs of moving and setting up services and utilities for themselves and their babies. Moreover, the funding would provide access to developmental programs such as those which would help them develop the skills needed in order to successfully transition and contribute to society successfully. They would be able to continue to have and rely on the support and assistance from Shifra Homes to ensure their success.

While assisting young pregnant women and their babies we address the basic human needs of providing a secure home, food security, food education, health and nutrition, transportation, counselling, parenting and life skills, and so much more. "Data shows that children from lone-mother families are more likely to have psychiatric and social difficulties." Our program "The Seeds of Hope" would allow us the opportunity to continue to provide our services to our young women and babies even when they have been discharged from our home and program. By having the ability to continue to provide all of the necessary support and assistance to these young women and babies we provide them with a continuous support system that will enable them to break the traditional cycle of poverty and other issues associated with their situations. When we have the ability to offer further support for these young women and babies we are enhancing their lives. Just the fact that they continue to be able to draw from our resources provides them with the necessary skills, abilities and resources to become self-reliant young adults that are able to integrate back into society as productive members that have gained the required coping and life skills to be successful. Our program and support would continue for each resident upon discharge from our home. We would continually assist the mom and baby with regular visits, stays, food, clothing, housewares, supplies and most importantly the support that is required. They would be taken to appointments and have to continuously attend programs at Shifra Homes.
