## **Accounting Changes**

Last year we changed our accounting system and practices. We implemented QuickBooks as our new accounting system. Donation receipts are now sent as soon as the donations are received.

In 2015 we crossed the threshold for donations and as a result have had to have our first audited financial statements. This is a remarkable accomplishment for Shifra Homes.



### Programs

We have expanded our programs as a result of the success that we have had.

### The Residential Program:

This is our leading program, and has been an on-going initiative for years. In this program, we accept young, homeless, pregnant women between the ages of 16 and 27 and assist them throughout their pregnancy and subsequent months following birth. At Shifra Homes we strive to build an environment which is embracing and nurturing for our residents. Our atmosphere is one in which we strive to encourage and develop a sense of stability, support and family.

### The Seeds of Hope Program:

During 2014 and 2015 we have been able to increase our support by supplementing one year's rent for each resident that has successfully applied for the Seeds of Hope Program's financial assistance. We expect this project to be continuous and plan to include it in our services for all of our future residents, with the financial support being offered should they successfully qualify. We have found it not only necessary to provide support to our residents during their stay at Shifra Homes but especially during their transition back into the community. This program has helped us ensure that these women do not return to homelessness but continue to be successful while living independently.

### **Programs**

### The Outreach Client Program:

Due to our limited space and resources, we aren't able to house every young woman who requests assistance. We have an extensive waiting list throughout the year of young, homeless, pregnant women looking for shelter, support and resources. However, even though we cannot house them in our Residential Program, we do make sure to refer them to other shelters and maintain an open door policy for them to stop by for support. In this past year, through funding we received for counselling services, we were able to provide an outreach client with access to our psychotherapist. This opportunity to assist young women in distress that aren't in our program is highly beneficial.

#### **The Family/Partner Program:**

In our home, we have found that our residents are successful because we help them work on the relationships in their lives that need assistance. We are constantly working with the involved families, healing relationships and acting as mediators and peacekeepers in interactions. Re-connecting our residents with healthy relationships in their lives provides them that extra support that they need.
